SIX NATIONS EMERGENCY PLAN

Through the dedication and expertise of many representatives of community services and agencies, and the Six Nations Elected Council, the Six Nations Emergency Response Plan has been in place since 1994. The Response Plan provides distinct measures and a set of guidelines for coordinated response to alleviate the impacts of a community emergency.

Community emergencies are situations or impending situations, man-made or natural, which threaten the general health, safety, welfare, property and environment of the people of Six Nations of the Grand River territory.

In the past, Six Nations of the Grand River has been impacted by emergency such as the Hagersville Tire Fire, the Train Derailment, and various Ice Storms. Six Nations has developed the Emergency Response Plan to respond to such disasters that would deal with and reduce the impact on the community.
