



Community Notice No. 6 - August 16, 2016
Six Nations Village Infrastructure Project

The following is an update from the last Community Notice, updating local residents and businesses of the presently ongoing watermain construction project.

Sierra Construction will be starting asphalt milling tomorrow as well as laying out stringlines for the new concrete curbs. Sierra will do their best in order to not interrupt driveways with the stringline. If the string happens to interfere with your driveway access, simply detach the string, hold it down and drive over it. The new curb is set to be installed starting early next week. While the new curb is being poured, residents and business owners will temporarily lose access to their driveways for approximately one day. We will provide further details as we get closer to pouring the curbs.

Construction Zone Reminder

During construction, the roadway may be limited to one lane. Traffic will be controlled by flaggers, so please be patient.

Reduce speeds throughout the construction zone. This is a safety concern for everyone and will be enforced.

We understand there will be many inconveniences and delays while the work is underway and everyone involved has taken all the necessary precautions and planning in order to maintain a smooth transition.
