### **Six Nations' Elected Council and Police Call on the Sûreté du Québec to Correct Tobacco Investigation Release**

Ohsweken (Mar 30, 2016) – Today, the Sûreté du Québec issued a press release claiming that a number of searches in the MYGALE project took place in residences and shops on Six Nations of the Grand River Territory.

The Elected Council and Six Nations Police would like to confirm that Six Nations of the Grand River was not involved in the searches conducted and that no arrests were made relating to contraband tobacco, by the Sûreté du Québec or any other law enforcement body, throughout the morning of Wednesday, March 30, 2016.
