Community money was spent on new signage



The Ministry of Indigenous Relations and Reconciliation (MIRR) awarded Six Nations Elected Council with a grant of eighteen thousand, five hundred forty-four dollars (\$18,544) towards the production of new community signs, in an effort to encourage unity and raise awareness of community safety within Six Nations of the Grand River Territory. The grant did not include installation fees.

Six Nations Elected Council was required to provide the cost for installation, in the amount of seven thousand, fourteen dollars (\$7,014) expensed from reallocated Ontario First Nations Limited Partnership (OFNLP) Funds.



Six Nations provided \$30,000 to assist with legal proceedings involving Akwesasne Hunters



As an Iroquois Caucus Community, Six Nations Elected Council annually contributes to an Iroquois Caucus Fund.

Given current legal proceedings involving Akwesasne Hunters and concerning all Iroquois Caucus Communities collective rights, Six Nations Elected Council has agreed to support the \$30,000 donation from the collective Iroquois Caucus Surplus.
