Six Nations  
High Average Awards

- ◆ All full-time Six Nations secondary students in Grade 9-12 are considered for the High Average Awards. Submit Report Card.
- ◆ Four out of the six highest grades must be within the same grade year to be considered.
- ◆ Marks obtained in night school and summer school will be considered.
- ◆ Average of marks must be higher than 75%.
- ◆ Certificates and monetary awards are presented to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place male and female students
- ◆ Students in multi-level programs will be recognized.

# SECONDARY STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAM

## For Six Nations Students ONLY

### ATTENDANCE ALLOWANCE

There are three attendance pay periods:

1. **September to December**  
- Cheques distributed in December
2. **January to March**  
- Cheques distributed in April
3. **April to June**  
- Cheques distributed in June

SUBMIT SCHOOL ATTENDANCE RECORD

- If students have no more than one un-excused absence per month, they are eligible to receive a **\$30.00** per month allowance for that pay period
- **One skipped class (truancy) disqualifies student for that month.**
- Students must present a note signed by the parent or guardian to the Attendance Clerk to be officially excused for the below-noted reason **immediately** upon return to school.

#### Excusable Absences:

- bereavement
- school activity
- longhouse
- illness (after 3 days a doctor's note is required)
- doctor and dental appointments.

#### Un-excused Absences:

- babysitting
- missed bus
- sleeping in
- vacation
- personal appointments e.g. prom preparation, birth certificates, driver's license.

### ADDITIONAL SUPPORT

(RECEIPTS FROM SCHOOL that states: student name, name of activity fee and amount paid must be submitted along with a Support Application)

**This fund encourages involvement in school activities. Funds are available for:**

- ♦ **course, participation and material fees**
- ♦ **school trips (max of \$200 per semester)**
- ♦ **other unforeseen school-related costs**

### CO-OP SUPPORT

**Full-time secondary students who are participating in a Co-op Placement for credit are eligible for support.**

**Co-op Program : Submit your Work Education Agreement Form:**

- **Co-op fees not covered by the secondary Co-op Program at your school**
- **transportation costs up to \$200 per semester**
- **work-related clothing costs up to \$200 per semester with receipts**

NOTE: Everyday clothing will not be covered.

### ATTENDANCE AWARDS

**Monetary awards are provided for Perfect Attendance (No Absences), Excellent Attendance (No Unexcused Absences) & Awesome (One Unexcused Absence). Awards are presented in August at the Six Nations General Council Meeting.**
