What is Restorative Justice?

Restorative Justice is an alternative model to the criminal justice system and focuses on repairing the harm between the person who **received harm** and the person who **caused harm**; through a circle process. Healing circles have always been a part of Haudenosaunee (people of the long house) culture, so we are now ready to revitalize our original way of healing our people across turtle island.

The Restorative Justice facilitators meet with everyone involved individually and discuss what to expect, plan and facilitate the Restorative Justice Circle.

Do you qualify for RJ?

- Q: Do you accept and acknowledge that you have caused harm and/or committed a crime?**
- Q: Do you currently live in Brantford or Six Nations and Identify as First Nations?**
- Q: If you have been charged with any of the following including breach charges you may be eligible;**
- Theft Under \$5,000
 - Possession Under \$5,000
 - Take Motor Vehicle without consent (joyriding)
 - Mischief Under \$5,000
 - Fraud under \$5000
 - False Pretenses Under \$5,000
 - Food, Travel or Accommodation Fraud
 - Causing a Disturbance
 - False statement under \$5,000

**THEN YOU ARE ELIGIBLE
FOR RESTORATIVE
JUSTICE!!**

Restorative Justice Questions:

- What happened?
- What were you thinking of at the time?
- What have you thought about since?
- Who has been affected by what happened? & In what way?
- What do you think needs to be done to repair the harm?

How to contact Restorative Justice:

Speak with your Lawyer, Justice of The Peace, Duty Council, or Court Worker about seeking a Restorative Justice diversion.
