



A By-Law to Provide for the Observance of Law and Order

Decision made at General Council Meeting April 9, 1959

BY-LAW NUMBER 4

The Council of the Six Nations of the Grand River Band of Indians at a meeting held Onswegen, Ontario, April 9, 1959, makes the following by-law pursuant to paragraph (c), (d) and (r) of Section 80 of the Indian Act.

By-law No. 4

A by-law to provide for the observance of law and order and the prevention of disorderly conduct and nuisances within the Six Nations Reserve, Ontario.

1. No person shall disturb, interrupt or disquiet any meeting of the Six Nations Council, any religious festival or any assemblage of Indians met for the consideration and discussion of matters of public interest or for any lawful purposes, by profane discourse, by rule or indecent behaviour or by making noise or noises either within the place of such meeting or near it as to disturb the order or solemnity of the meeting.
2. No person shall spit on the floor of the Council House or on the floor of the Six Nations Schools or of any public building.
3. No person shall use insulting or abusive language toward any person on the Reserve.
4. Any person who violates this by-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 60 days or to both the said punishments.
